Parent's Evening



Our Autumn Parents Evenings will take place between 3:30pm and 7pm on Monday 20th and Wednesday 22nd November. This is an opportunity for you to book an appointment to meet your child's teacher on a one-to-one basis, to find out how your child has settled into their new class and how they are getting on in school. We really value the opportunity to share this information with you so please do book an appointment.

This term, the appointments will be in person, in school (NOT online). The meetings will take place in the school halls, which is a successful model used in primary and secondary schools across the country. Appointments will be 10 minutes long and will be timed to ensure that they don't overrun.

Appointments can be booked through our School Cloud System - https://gossopsgreen.schoolcloud.co.uk/- and instructions for how to book an appointment can be found at the end of this newsletter. Please be aware that, to allow for travelling time, sibling appointments must have a 10-minute gap between them. The booking system will open at 8am on Tuesday 31st October and appointments are available on a first-come-first-served basis. If you are unable to attend either day, please log onto the system and let the teacher know so that we know not to send you reminders. Please be aware that you will not be able to book appointments before the booking system opens.

Damaged Reading Books

Parents in EYFS and Key Stage 1 will be familiar with the RWI books that we send home to support children with their reading. These books were bought new last year at a considerable cost to the school of several thousand pounds.

Sadly, we have had **47** damaged books between January-July and already **10** irreparably damaged books just this half term. The cost of replacing these books is **over £300**.

As a school, we cannot afford to replace this many books, so we do keep detailed records of who takes home each book and **parents are charged** for the cost of the replacement book if it is damaged in their child's care. Most of the books have been affected by water damage, where water bottles have leaked next to books or books have got wet in the rain. Please can we ask that you help your children keep their water bottles away from the books to protect them and save you the cost of replacing them.



Thank you for your support with taking care of the books and reading with your children; it really does make a significant difference to their learning.


Walk Once a Week



Parents' Guide for Booking Parent Evening Appointments

Browse to https://gossopsgreen.schoolcloud.co.uk/



Step 1: Login

Fill out the details on the page then click the *Log In* button. Please note that you will need to be listed as the primary carer with the school in order to access the system. A confirmation of your appointments will be sent to the email address you provide.



Step 2: Select Parents' Evening

Click on the date you wish to book.

Unable to make all of the dates listed? Click I'm unable to attend.



Step 3: Select Booking Mode

Choose *Automatic* if you'd like the system to suggest the shortest possible appointment schedule based on the times you're available to attend. To pick the times to book with each teacher, choose *Manual*. Then press *Next*. We recommend choosing the automatic booking mode when browsing on a mobile device.



Step 4: Choose Teachers

If you chose the automatic booking mode, drag the sliders at the top of the screen to indicate the earliest and latest you can attend. Select the teachers you'd like to book appointments with. A green tick indicates they're selected. To de-select, click on their name.



Step 5a (Automatic): Book Appointments

If you chose the automatic booking mode, you'll see provisional appointments which are held for 2 minutes. To keep them, choose Accept at the bottom left.

If it wasn't possible to book every selected teacher during the times you are able to attend, you can either adjust the teachers you wish to meet with and try again, or switch to manual booking mode (Step 5b).



Step 5b (Manual): Book Appointments

Click any of the green cells to make an appointment. Blue cells signify where you already have an appointment. Grey cells are unavailable. To change an appointment, delete the original by hovering over the blue box and clicking *Delete*. Then choose an alternate time. Once you're finished booking all appointments, at the top of the page in the alert box, press *click here* to finish the booking process.
